Guest Speaker: Jennifer Wen Ma

Ma was born in 1973 in Beijing, China, and received her Master of Fine Arts degree in 1999 from the Pratt Institute, New York. Ma's interdisciplinary practice bridges media as varied as installation, video, drawing, fashion design, public art and performance. In 2008, Ma was one of the seven members on the core creative team for the opening and closing ceremonies of the Beijing Olympics. She also won an Emmy for the US broadcast of the ceremony. One of her upcoming projects is permanent public lighting installation for the façade of National Aquatic Center, aka The Water Cube, Beijing.

Guest Performing Artist: Jiayi Sun

Sun, born in Shenyang, China, is one of the most remarkable Chinese pianists of her generation. Her early prizes include: 2002 First Prize, Group Age 12~16, St. Petersburg Fourth International Children Piano "A Step to Master" Competition; 2004 First Prize, The Fourth Moscow International Frederick Chopin Competition for Young Pianists. In 2010, at Maestro Tan Dun's invitation, Sun was the soloist for the piano concerto of *The Banquet* with the China Youth Symphony at the Shanghai 2010 World Expo and the Lincoln Center Summer Festival with the Metropolis Ensemble.
